The funding has been provided to ensure impact against the following objective:

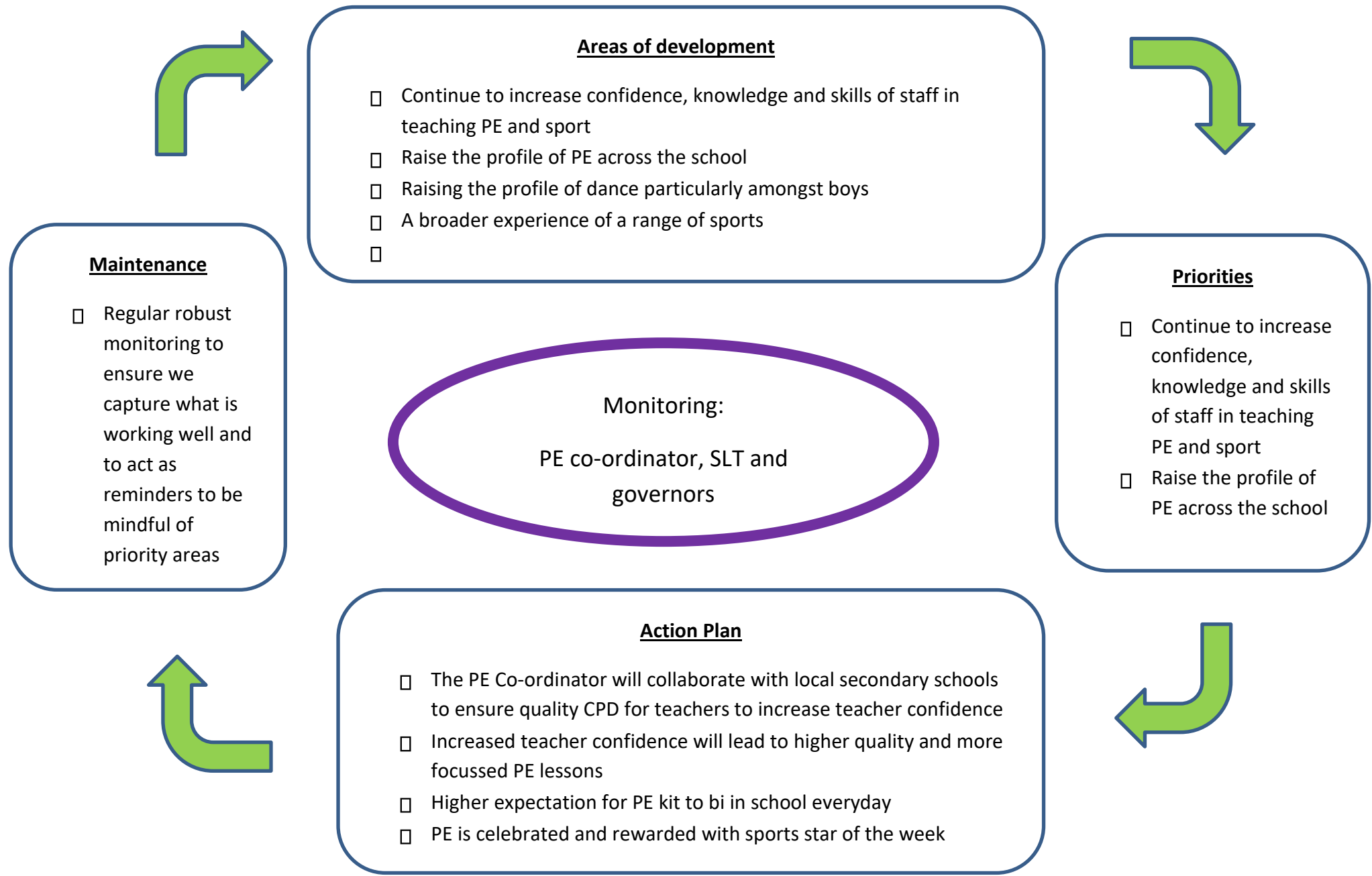
