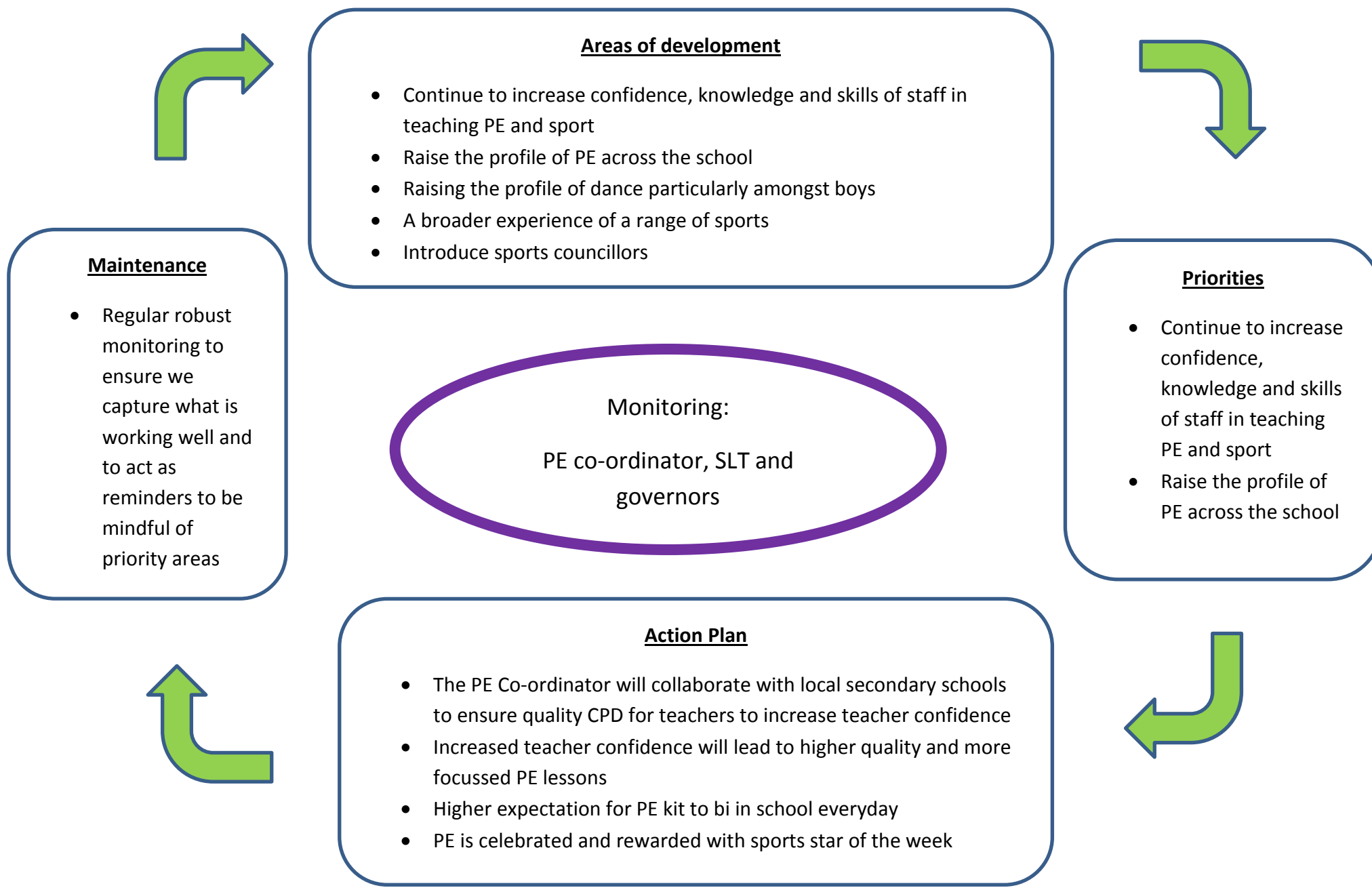
We expect Roman Way to see an improvement against the following 5 key indicators
