PE/SPORT PREMIUM- 2015-2016

In 2015-16 each of the three schools in the Discovery Federation will receive the second of three annual PE/sport premium funding. This money will be used to support each school independently in their needs and requirements to ensure the teachers are able to provide a range of opportunities for all children in which will impact and further develop their learning within the PE curriculum.

Roman Way Primary School

The annual PE/sports premium funding for Roman Way Junior School is £8725. This funding will be used to support continued professional development for teaching staff, resourcing the new PE curriculum and to promote PE and sport within the school through the organisation of competitions and extra-curricular activities.
